5.3.6. Qualification of the harm as 'threat to (a civilian's) life or person'

This country guidance is currently under review. In view of the recent significant changes in Syria, notably the fall of the Assad regime, some conclusions within this document may no longer be valid. When examining the international protection needs of applicants from Syria, please consider the most up-to-date country of origin information available.

COMMON ANALYSIS

Last update: February 2023

Some of the commonly reported types of harm to civilians' life or person in Syria include killing, injury, abduction, child recruitment, explosive remnants of war, etc. A real risk of such serious harm would qualify a threat to a (civilian's) life or person in accordance with the provision of [Article 15\(c\) QD](#).
