



EASO Case Law Database

The platform serves as a point of reference for European and national case law on asylum, providing the jurisprudential counterpart to the Information and Documentation System (IDS) and data collection under the Early Warning and Preparedness System (EPS).



The [EASO Case Law Database](#) is an online public platform developed by EASO to:

- ✚ Manage and store information on case law related to the Common European Asylum System (CEAS) issued by national and international courts;
- ✚ Provide up-to-date, accurate information on new jurisprudence; and
- ✚ Compile relevant cases in the field of asylum issued by national and international courts.

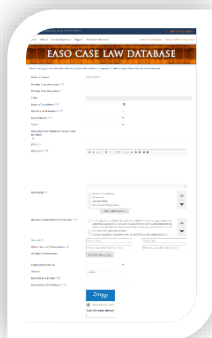
The database serves as a centralised platform on jurisprudential developments related to asylum. It covers cases issued by:

- ✚ National courts, mainly decisions from upper courts;
- ✚ Court of Justice of the European Union (CJEU);
- ✚ European Court of Human Rights (ECtHR) related to international protection; and
- ✚ Jurisprudence from quasi-judicial organs, such as United Nations Treaty Bodies, the Human Rights Committee (CCPR) and the Committee against Torture (CAT) which review complaints from individuals.

- ✚ [Search bar](#) where search criteria can be specified (e.g. a specific year or period, relevant legislation, keywords).

Case submission and sources



Jurisprudence is included in the database from various sources of information:

- ✚ IDS on the Common European Asylum System
- ✚ EASO Annual Report, with contributions from:
 - EU+ countries
 - EASO networks (i.e. the EASO Courts and Tribunals Network)
 - UN High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR)
 - Civil society organisations
 - Academia
- ✚ Other EASO reports and products

Overviews of [judicial institutions](#) and [civil society/academia databases](#) are now available. These do not replace existing court or case law databases so references to official sources are included in the case overview.

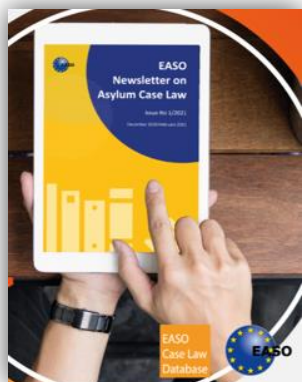
