- A conference on digital innovation was organised on 13 and 14 June by the EUAA, together with GDISC (1) and IGC (2) and with the involvement of JHA agencies. The aim was to take stock of technological developments and needs centred around the wider context of asylum and migration. The meeting was attended by participants from 24 States including the United States of America (US); the European Commission, and five other JHA agencies

The conference provided an opportunity to gain an overview of the state of play of digital innovation in the field of asylum and migration and discuss interesting examples from the Member States and different JHA agencies. More specifically, the meeting focused on challenges and opportunities of interconnectivity of systems at national and international

levels (e.g., in the context of interoperability of large-scale EU systems) and showcased inspiring cross-border cooperation in the field of justice and home affairs. Building on the lessons learned at a thematic meeting held in 2021, the discussion also touched upon new developments regarding the digitalisation of identification procedures. Digitalisation constitutes a common challenge for public administrations, be it at national or EU level, in the field of asylum, migration or law enforcement alike. Cooperation in this regard, within the EU and between the EU and partner countries can be mutually beneficial.

Implementation of the European Green Deal in JHA Agencies In February 2023, the EUAA conducted a survey of JHA agencies' environmental and

greening activities to determine the current situation, to identify areas of interest for future activities in this regard by the JHAAN, and to take stock of the agencies' efforts, best practices and lessons learned. A focus was on registration with the Commission's Eco-Management and Audit Scheme (EMAS). The results of the survey provide a baseline of

the current state of play across all JHA agencies in this regard. Moreover, the results

demonstrate the JHA agencies' shared commitment to stepping up their environmental and greening activities. The survey report was published online in July 2023 and can be accessed here. Cybersecurity exercises The risk of cyberattacks on Member States and other strategic targets, including EU institutions, bodies and agencies, has intensified in the recent years. In addition, digitalisation and interoperability efforts are increasing, thus extending the risks of affecting each other in case of a cyberattack. Under the EUAA presidency, the network focused on

resilience of the JHA agencies against potential cyber threats. Two cybersecurity exercises among JHA agencies were organised during the year. In May, an exercise focused on probing the technical knowledge within the agencies regarding cybersecurity. In addition to practical

Information provision in mixed migration situations The provision of information in mixed migration settings was proposed by the EUAA as one of the thematic priorities for its presidency. This highlighted the importance of adequate information provision in situations such as upon disembarkation after search and rescue in the Mediterranean or mass arrivals of displaced persons at the external borders. As many agencies come together in situations like these, this priority allowed the exchange information and experiences and to strengthen cooperation between JHA agencies in this area.

This means that the chairing agency proposes the priorities of the network for a particular year and organises work of the network throughout a year. In 2023, the European Union Agency for Asylum held the presidency of the network. Trio coordination presidency In 2021, the network adopted the JHAAN Assessment report which described key achievements of the network and, in addition, provided a set

of recommendations to ensure better coordination inside and outside of the network, to improve its functioning and to increase the network's visibility. One of the concrete results of these recommendations was the establishment of a Trio presidency concept which was introduced at the beginning of 2022. This concept brings three consecutive presidencies close together to enhance continuity and coordination in the network from one
