### **The Asylum Procedure in the Pact on Migration and Asylum**

The Asylum Procedure in the Pact on Migration and Asylum: This training guides the learner through the asylum procedures, presenting the new and revised provisions with a focus on the Asylum Procedures Regulation (APR). The training highlights aspects such as the basic principles and guarantees and the administrative procedure from the screening and access until a decision is notified to the applicant for international protection, including special procedures and the safe country concepts.

Learning Outcomes: 1. Outline the screening process, in relation to access to the asylum procedure; 2. Explain some of the most relevant changes the APR brings to the asylum procedure.

Expected study time is: 6 hours

### **The Reception Conditions Directive in the Pact on Migration and Asylum**

The Reception Conditions Directive in the Pact on Migration and Asylum: This training provides learners with knowledge on provisions of the new recast Reception Conditions Directive. It focuses on main changes introduced by the Directive related to aspects such as material reception conditions, organisation of reception systems, detention, specific reception needs, early integration measures and contingency planning.

Learning Outcome: Outline the main changes introduced by the 2024 Reception Conditions Directive

Expected study time is: 4 hours

### **The new Asylum and Migration Management Regulation (AMMR)**

The new Asylum and Migration Management Regulation (AMMR) The training aims to provide learners with knowledge on the highlights of the new Asylum and Migration Management Regulation, which replaces the Dublin Regulation. More specifically, it enables learners to identify the changes introduced to the criteria and mechanisms for determining the Member State responsible for examining an application for international protection and the main elements of the newly established solidarity mechanism.

Learning Outcomes: 1. Identify the main changes introduced by the AMMR relating to the criteria in determining the MS responsible for examining an application for international protection; 2. Identify main changes introduced by the AMMR relating to the procedures followed in the context of determining the MS responsible for examining an application for international protection; 3. Identify the main elements of the solidarity mechanism and the procedural steps of relocation.

Expected study time is: 4 hours



### **Vulnerability in the Pact on Migration and Asylum**

Vulnerability in the Pact on Migration and Asylum: While the need to identify, assess and address vulnerability and special needs of applicants for international protection was recognised by the different instruments of the Common European Asylum System, the adoption of the New Pact on Migration and Asylum brings numerous changes that are relevant from the perspective of access to procedures, safeguards, rights and obligations, as well as reception arrangements provided to vulnerable persons, including children. This training aims to provide an overview of the main provisions around vulnerability, as captured across the different instruments of the New Pact on Migration and Asylum.

Learning Outcome: Outline changes in the vulnerability related provisions brought through the Pact on Asylum and Migration.

Expected study time is: 6 hours

### **Pact on Migration and Asylum: key legislative changes**

This course combines all the four above-listed tailor-made-training together in one training. Learners will have the chance to follow the content of ‘The Asylum Procedure in the Pact on Migration and Asylum’, ‘The Reception Conditions Directive in the Pact on Migration and Asylum’, ‘The new Asylum and Migration Management Regulation (AMMR)’, ‘Vulnerability in the Pact on Migration and Asylum’, in one course.

Learning Outcome: Outline the main changes introduced by the legislation coming from the Pact on Asylum and Migration in the area of asylum procedure, reception, AMMR and vulnerability.

Expected study time is: 20 hours

### **Contingency planning as part of the Pact on Migration and Asylum**

The webinar on Contingency planning template and manual provides participants with insight on the main aspects of the contingency planning methodology suggested by EUAA. The webinar mirrors the manual to outline how Member States can fill in the contingency planning template and offers possibilities to ask questions.
